WORKSHOP 1

“How to develop a promising research proposal”

Every research project requires a promising concept: Whether you are applying for a scholarship, a doctoral program, a postdoc position or a current research project, you must develop and write down a research proposal. Therefore, you need to align all necessary components of the concept to a clear and appropriate research aim and establish a convincing structure of ideas. The short session will provide you with tools for this demanding task. To prepare text production solidly, you will receive strategies to get into the routines of project development and focus.

WORKSHOP 2

“Time Management – The basics for your PhD in a nutshell”

Female doctoral students often feel stressed about the diverse responsibilities they have. Not surprisingly, the goal of their doctorate thus often slips from focus. In this workshop, the participants learn how to keep the focus on their goal and what they can do to make better use of their time. Topics covered: What does time management comprise? Analysis of your own way of managing time, detection of time thieves, developing methods of action to keep time thieves at bay, tips for efficient time management.

WORKSHOP 3

„Media training: Successful in front of the camera“

How do you best prepare for an interview presenting your own research topic? How do you develop messages that reach the public? And how do you skillfully answer questions when journalists want to know more or ask critical questions?

The workshop prepares scientists for dealing with media. Each participant stands in front of the camera. The participants develop statements, train interview situations and receive feedback from the trainers on argumentation, comprehensibility as well as voice and body language. The basics of media law and crisis communication are also presented using the example of “Talking about animal experiments”. The workshop will be offered parallel in German and English.
